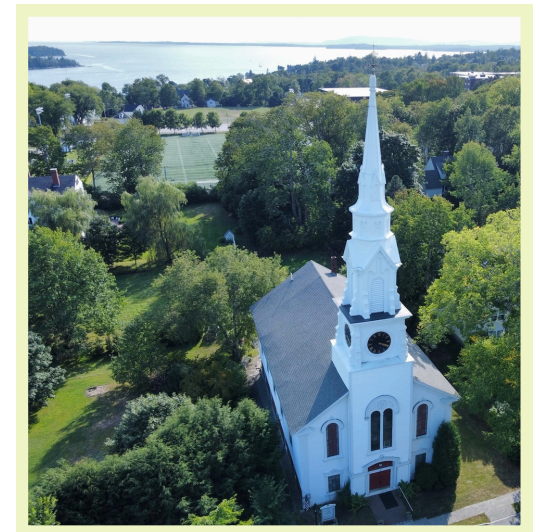

An **ecumenical Bible study** is held over Zoom every Tuesday morning from 9-10 AM.



We offer **Christian education** in an after-school program, for children in grades pre-K and up, that explores the fruits of the Spirit in story and in song.

The **TCP Choir**, led by Heather Emanuelson, is open to all!



The **Dr. Mary Cushman Circle** holds two annual fund raisers - the Village Fair and the Holly Berry Fair - to support global and community health and wellness initiatives.



In the summer and fall, **Spirit & Nature walks** provide an opportunity to explore the beauty of God's creation during a time of contemplative walking.



Children are welcome in worship! We offer **care and activities for children** in the childrens' corner in our vestry.

The **Prayer Shawl ministry** knits and distributes prayer shawls to bring comfort and blessings to anyone in need.



Book groups and other adult study opportunities are held regularly throughout the year. Recent reads include: *Sacred Earth*, *Sacred Nature*; *The Amen Effect*, and *How Not to Be Afraid*.
